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MALTA WORK EXPERIENCE 23/24

This project enabled the work experience of 26 students of the Business School and Further Education College Brno to Malta for two weeks (10 working days) in October 23 and April 24.





We received the grant from the European Union project Erasmus+ and 26 students + 2 teachers could travel to Malta in October 2023. We are the 17th group that were given this chance to live and work in an English-speaking country for two weeks. Everything was financed by the European Union. All we needed was pocket money.

During the time we worked in various Maltese companies: BCP Real Estate, Western Regional Council, Level Academy, QuickLets & Zanzi Homes, etc.

We became part of a team and were supervised at all times by at least one mentor. We participated in everyday procedures and developed new specialised skills in the field of our study. The managers prepared daily work tasks and monitored our progress together with our accompanying teachers. The managers evaluated our achievements at the end of the working experience.

Most of us worked in different companies. Those of us who are students of business school worked with business correspondence and with databases of clients, prepared presentations, dealt with internet enquiries, answered phones, took messages, served and advised customers and supported senior staff. We did some market research, assisted in various computerized activities such as processing, data input, emailing. We worked with internal IT system, PCs, printers, scanners and other office equipment. We also had some general duties such as filling, faxing and photocopying. We assisted and communicated with customers on daily basis and thus improved their communication skills.

The typical tasks of students of information services and librarianship were answering reference inquiries, lending documents to the user via automatic library systems, creating catalogue records of documents and books, modifying records in the database of books, looking up relevant records and communication with clients.

After working hours we had free time which we spent together or went sightseeing. We lived in apartments with a kitchenette where we could cook. Every once in a while we met with mentors from Travelmania, which is the partner of our school in Erasmus+. If we had any problem we could consult it with our teachers or a Travelmania employee.

It was great experience for all of us because we learned new skills and improved our English. At the end of the two weeks work placement project a ceremony was held to celebrate our achievements – we received the certificates of completing our work placement. We also received references from our employers and Europass Mobility. Some of us were offered a part-time job for summer.

Our programme



On the first day when we came to Malta we were given Tallinja Explore cards for unlimited travelling on the island. We met our mentor Claire from the intermediary organization Travelmania who told us details about travelling and working. After the meeting we had to find our way to our companies and take a selfie which we had to show to our accompanying teachers. On Monday we started working.



From Monday to Friday we were working, but after work we went sightseeing. We visited e. g. Valetta, Sliema, St Julian's, Mdina. We swam and sunbathed on various beaches.

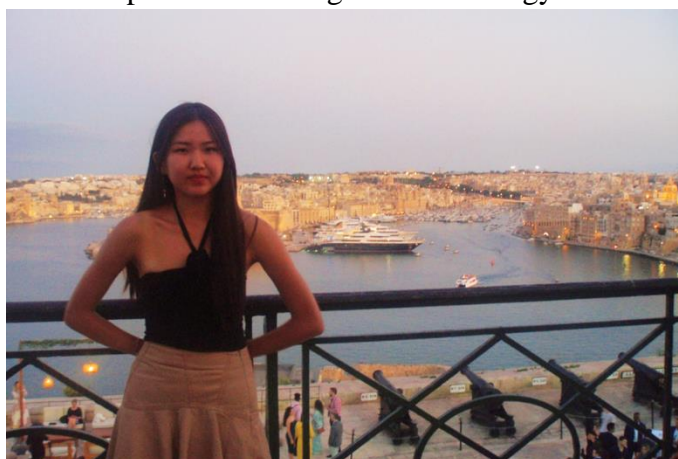
At the weekend, we went for a trip to Gozo - the northern island of the Republic of Malta.

In the end each of us received Europass Mobility. On Friday we said goodbye to Malta and travelled back to Brno.

We managed work in companies without problems and our employers appraised our communication skills, professional skills and work attitude. We improved our skills in contact with customers, administrative work and use of information technologies. We also learned to

present their work to our colleagues or customers in a suitable way, which contributed to the development of our soft-skills. We broadened our professional English terminology. All these aspects will enable us to gain competitive advantage at the labour market. New experience from Maltese companies will be used during our further education and practice.

Work experience abroad is nothing to worry about. If you doubt it read about our experience in this brochure. It can be your turn next year! Our participants will give you advice and help you to be prepared!

Work

My internship in Malta was a great experience for me. During this time I had the opportunity to work in the Local Government and carry out various administrative tasks. This placement allowed me to gain a deeper understanding of the functioning of the Maltese state apparatus and to improve my administrative skills.



My work was varied. every day I was given different tasks, for example, I did inventory, sorted and filed invoices, and helped the boss. The atmosphere at the workplace was very pleasant and friendly. All our colleagues were very nice to us and were very happy to help us with everything. They wanted to talk to us and also gave us tips for many trips to Malta.

Accommodation

We stayed at Hostel Paradise in Gzira, Malta. Located in the heart of the charming town of Gzira, Hostel Paradise is a cozy and clean accommodation. There was a bus stop about five minutes from our accommodation from which you could get to Valletta in 20 minutes.

We were divided into two groups, the first group stayed on the first floor and the second group stayed right on the second floor. I was in the room with two other students. Each of us had a bed, a wardrobe and a night table.

We shared a kitchen and a bathroom with the rest of the students. The kitchen was clean and well-equipped. I cooked my lunch every day for work, but I forgot to bring my lunch boxes (so make sure you don't forget them).

We used to go shopping at Lidl and Nonstopmarket. The nonstopmarket was right next to our apartment and we took a bus to Lidl about 10 minutes away. The prices in Lidl are almost the same as in the Czech Republic. The prices in restaurants are much higher than in the Czech Republic, but you can find cheaper places.

Free time

In my free time, I went to the beaches most often. The best beaches are far away (usually an hour to an hour and a half by bus): Paradise Bay, Golden Bay, Ġhajn Tuffieħa Bay.

In Malta, make sure to visit the historic city of Valletta, a UNESCO World Heritage site known for its Baroque architecture, museums, and stunning harbor views. Don't miss the megalithic temples at Hagar Qim and Mnajdra, some of the world's oldest freestanding structures. Enjoy the natural beauty of Gozo, Malta's sister island, with attractions like the Citadel in Victoria and the Azure Window (now collapsed but still picturesque). Lastly, indulge in the crystal-clear waters of the Blue Grotto and the Blue Lagoon on the island of Comino, perfect for swimming, snorkeling, and relaxation.

When visiting Valletta, make sure to explore the historic St. John's Co-Cathedral, known for its stunning Baroque interior and Caravaggio's artwork, and take in the breathtaking views from the Upper Barrakka Gardens, overlooking the Grand Harbour.

Work

I had the opportunity to work in a company that not only offered perfect communication among colleagues



but also had very friendly people. From the moment I joined the company, I was greeted with warmth and kindness by my colleagues. They were always ready to lend a helping hand

and make me feel like a part of the team. Local Government Building is not a company, but a state administration. I worked in a department that dealt with waste. That is, control of the export of sorted waste in individual cities and on individual days of the given month.

Accommodation

The accommodation offered essential equipment for a comfortable stay. The spacious rooms were equipped with air conditioning. Although the living room's air conditioning was non-functional. In our room there was a balcony. In our apartment for seven people there were two bathrooms. We even had a washing machine that allowed us to fulfill our laundry needs without hassle. The equipped kitchen consisting of a large fridge with freezer, stove, oven, kettle, toaster, and microwave oven allowed us to prepare our own meals. However, it was essential to note that the water was undrinkable, which required the purchase of bottled water for drinking purposes.

Free time

During our free time, we had the opportunity to explore the local attractions and amenities. One of the highlights was a trip to the capital city, Valletta. This historical city offered a glimpse into Malta's rich culture and heritage. Additionally, walking around Gzira, the city where the apartment was located, provided a chance to appreciate the beautiful surroundings.



However, one challenge we encountered during our free time was the traffic situation. It was probably the worst traffic I had ever experienced. The buses, which served as a common mode of transportation, often did not run according to the designated schedule. They operated on their own terms, resulting in delays and inconvenience. Furthermore, if the bus was full, it did not stop at the designated stops unless someone got off. This caused huge delays and frustration among commuters. About 30 meters away from our apartment there was a grocery store but the prices were a bit higher. That's why I had to commute approximately 10 minutes to Lidl, which proved to be a convenient option. Lidl offered a wide range of products, catering to various needs. The prices were also acceptable, making it a favorable choice for grocery shopping.

In conclusion, my work experience in a company with a pleasant and friendly working environment, perfect communication, and friendly colleagues was truly remarkable. The provision of comfortable accommodation added to the overall convenience. Despite the challenges faced during our free time, such as the traffic and unreliable bus schedules, the

opportunity to explore the local sights and amenities, as well as convenient shopping options, made it a memorable experience.

Work

Me and my classmate worked in the National Bibliographic Office which is a part of the National Library responsible for legal deposit. They gave us a lot of different work tasks, some easier than others but also made sure we rested. We worked for seven and a half hours.



We had a kitchenette with a microwave, a fridge and a kettle. Our coworkers liked to share stories and fun facts about their lives, Malta, the near area and even some about the history of the Czech Republic. On our last day, our supervisor gave us a cheesecake as a goodbye gift.

Accommodation

We lived in an appartement in Gzira, there were seven students sharing one apartment. One apartment contained three rooms, two bathrooms, a kitchenette and a living room. If something happened not to work, someone came to repair it as soon as possible. It was nice looking, the shop was not far and the coast was two minutes away. We cooked for ourselves, washed our clothes, it was approximately four minutes to the bus station. The restaurants and bars were near, but it was in a calm area.

Free time

The public transport was good, sometimes the buses were late or did not even stop, so we had to be earlier at the bus stop, just to be sure we get to work on time, otherwise it was really quick and effective. The shop we visited the most was named Orient market, which was a minute away from our appartement. The prices were mostly the same as they are in the Czech Republic. There was also a Lidl, which was not too far, and it was a nice walk through the beautiful streets. The night life was



amazing and we had bars and restaurants near. There are some beautiful attractions, cruises and sights to see on Malta. There are awesome beaches, we visited the Golden Bay which was a very nice sand beach, only an hour away from our apartment. We also visited the Manoel Island and Valleta.

Work

I worked at the National Bibliographic Office (NBO) with one of my classmates. NBO is a part of the National Library responsible for legal deposit, it started in 2017. Legal deposit is every book, periodical, series, pamphlets etc. published in the country. In Malta the legal deposit is available for a present loan in the Malta National Library and the Gozo National Library, for reference in the Czech Republic legal deposit is available in the National Library, The Moravian Library and in the Olomouc Research Library. Our supervisor was Dr. Stephen Borg, who informed us about the history of Malta and the importance of legal deposit. Mr. Borg told us and showed us what to do and when he wasn't present at the moment our colleague Margaret would help us. Our other colleagues were Andrea, Carmen and Judith. For our last three days an intern from Germany came, her name was Fenja and she didn't speak English very well so we even practised some German when speaking with her. The workplace was small, full of boxes with books, but our colleagues were very friendly and always wanted to help us with something. Our tasks were sorting through periodicals to help Andrea with her job of checking

them on their library system, working with old gifted newspapers, preparing books for the National library of Gozo (stamping, sticking in barcodes and writing an identification number) and some small



tasks to help Mr. Borg with his work. On our last day me, my classmate and Fenja went to the National Library in Valletta for a tour. Overall it was a great experience and I'm very happy we had such nice and helpful colleagues.

Accommodation

We lived in 2 apartments in one building in Gzira, close to the harbour. Our apartment had two bathrooms, three rooms for two, two and three people and a kitchenette with a living room. Every room had air conditioning, there was a toaster, a kettle, a microwave, a fridge and an oven in the kitchenette. Our apartment was very close to a convenience shop which was open from 6.30 to midnight, restaurants, bars, main street, a bus stop and harbour.

Free time

In our free time we went for a tour of the capital Valletta, we went to see a 5D film about Malta. We went on a Gozo, Comino and Blue Lagoon tour. First we got on a boat and headed to the island of Gozo, where a bus took us from the harbour to the capital of Gozo - Victoria/Rabat, where we had two hours of free time. Then a bus took us back to the boat and we went to Blue Lagoon in Comino, where we had two hours to swim in the Blue Lagoon. The water was blue, clear and warm. When we came back in the evening, six of us from our apartment decided to go to a restaurant together. The next day we took a bus to Golden Bay. It is a very popular sandy beach. It took us an hour to get there by bus. We also went on a harbour cruise, which was very interesting and we saw a lot of very interesting ships and parts of cities. Traffic in Malta is very confusing at first because they drive on the left side and people don't use blinkers very often, but after a couple of days you will get used to it. When taking a bus to work we had to wait at the bus stop at least twenty minutes earlier before our bus was supposed to come because the bus drivers didn't follow the timetables. Commuting in Malta fortunately doesn't take much time because of the size of the island.

Work

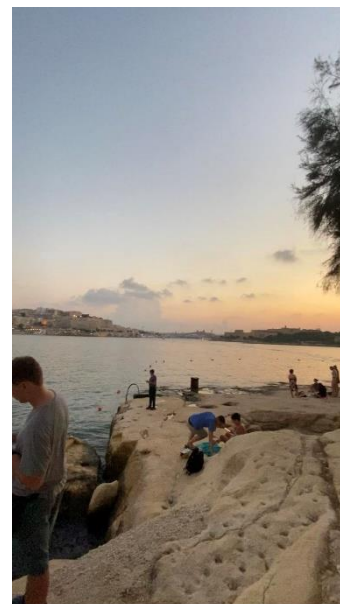
During my unforgettable Erasmus experience in Malta, I had the privilege of working with BCP Real Estate. It was an amazing experience that allowed me to not only gain valuable

Apartments

We were living in two apartments. One by seven people, I was living with Lenka, Ujin, Denisa, Annička, Anet and Áďa. And close to the apartments we had the bus stop and a shop.

Both apartments had their own kitchen, 2 bathrooms, 3 rooms, 2 rooms for two people and 1 for three and the one for three had a balcony. We had a big room where the kitchen, 1 bathroom, the living and dining room were all connected together. There also was a washing room with a washing machine.

In the kitchen we had a fridge with freezer next to it was a kitchen unit and on it was a microwave with a kettle and a toaster. Next to it was an oven and next to it was another kitchen unit with some sort of a cutting board I believe. Above these was a cooker extractor hood and there was one cupboard on each side. Accommodation

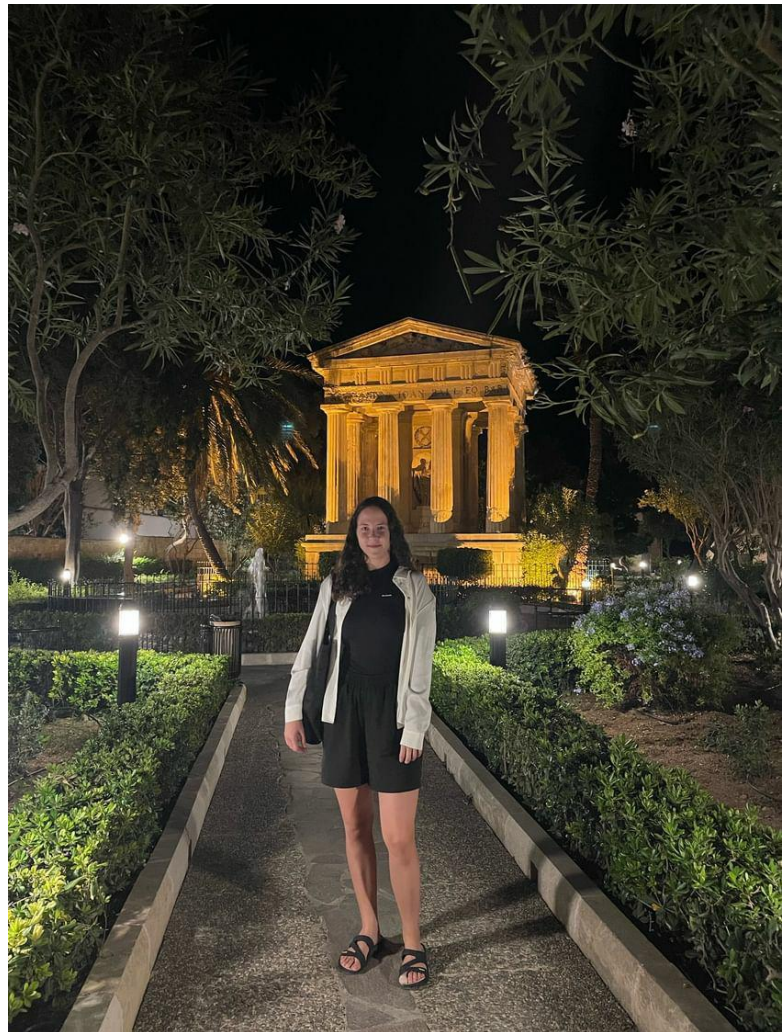

Free Time

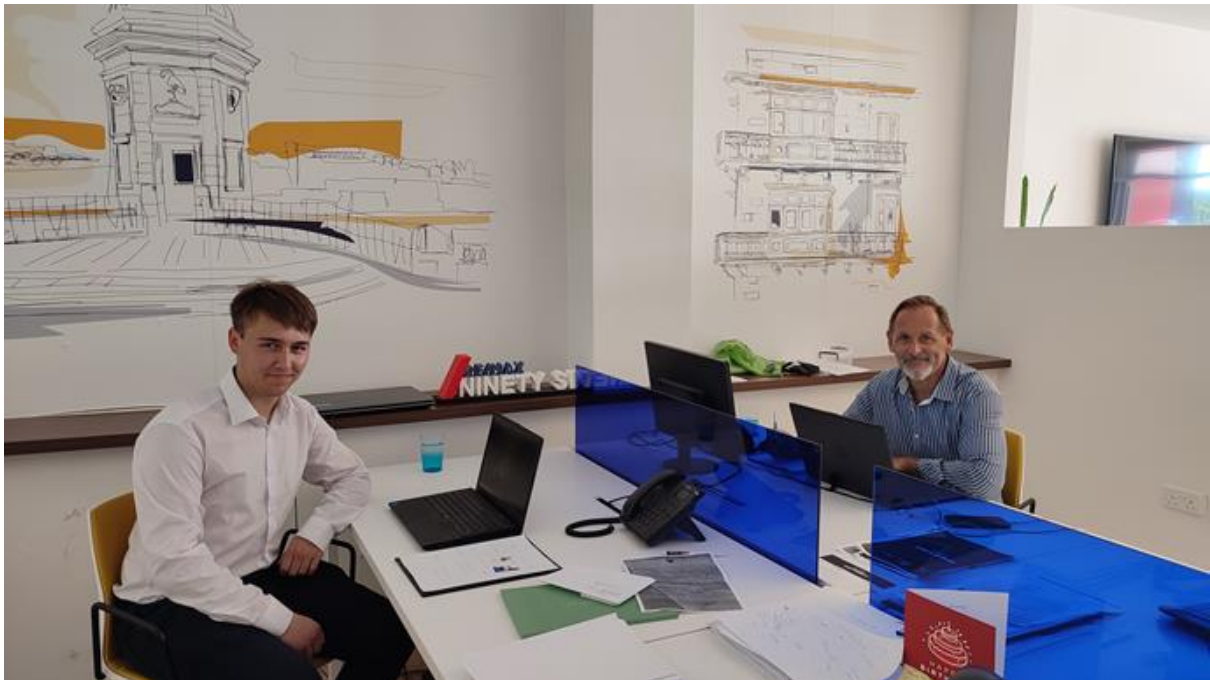

Free time

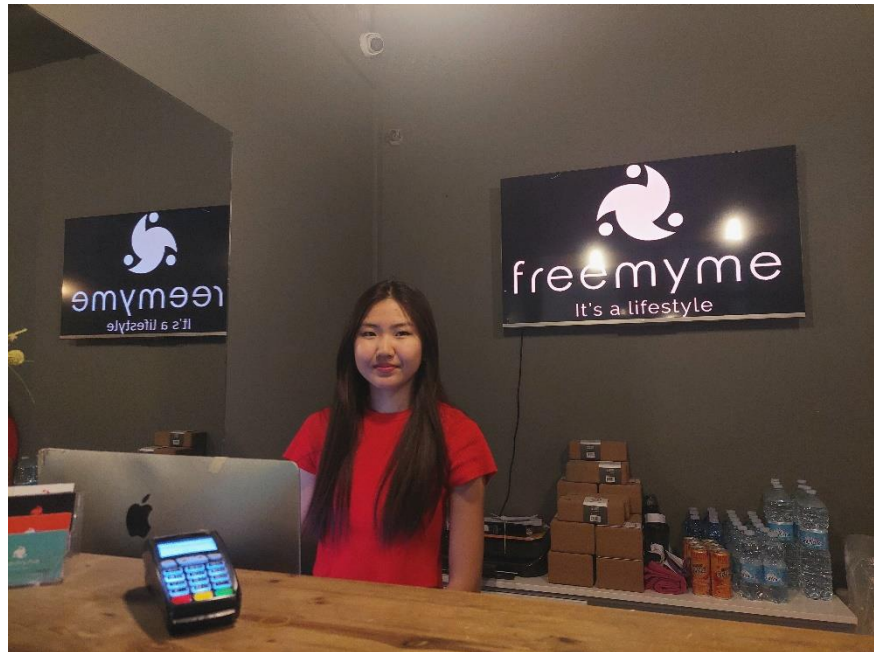

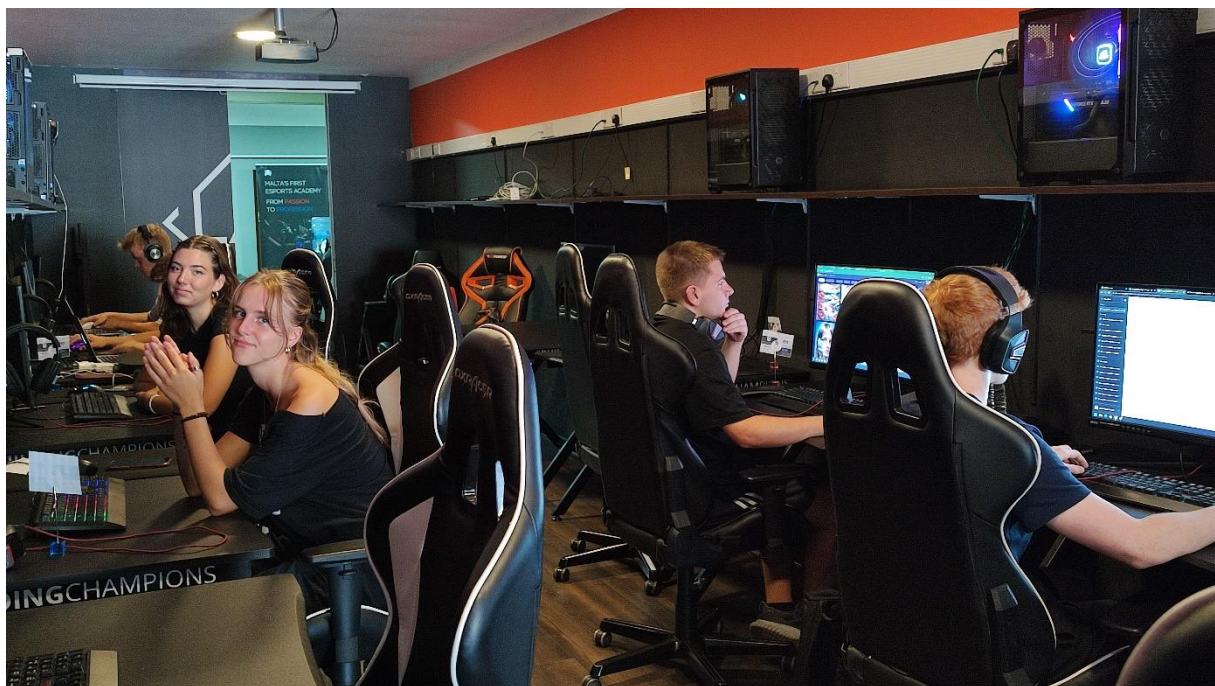

Accommodation

The ten days of our internship started with a seemingly easy task – that is to get to work. However, on the first day we were faced with the reality of Maltese public transport. In my experience, it doesn't get stuck in traffic, like ours in Czech Republic. The problem is that the busses don't stop on bus stops at all. There simply aren't enough buses to take all the people to work or to school in the morning. That means a possibility of a bus driver just waving at you from behind the windscreen and passing you by, because of how it's already full. That can happen three times in a row.



The best solution for this problem is to walk on your own two feet. If you can't, I recommend making sure you have some extra time to wait on the bus stop.

It's ok not to come exactly on time on your first day, because they know of the trial you have been put through. For work advice, just be genuine and open-minded while you learn the ropes. Come dressed as you're told by the teachers. It's best to come prepared, so when you are to be dressed smart, do so and then ask there or just see what the others are wearing.

Your tasks won't be anything extra difficult and should be easy to grasp. Use your English as much as possible so that you improve.

Accommodation

The water is drinkable. Well... In the kitchen at least. And yes, it tastes disgusting. Boiling it helps a little. I recommend bringing or buying some tea, so that you don't have to taste it the first thing in the morning. Buying packed water is also an option if you have the money. At least occasionally when you feel like you qualify for a reward.

Cans and plastic bottles can be recycled and a deposit to motivate people to do so is included in the price. If you have the time, save money and help the planet.

Free time

You should definitely at least dip in the water. For swimming, you might want to check out the Golden Bay or St. Pauls Bay, if you aren't interested in rocky beaches with high waves like on Sliema beach. We also found a spot in Valletta, but I don't remember, where it was as we kind of stumbled upon it by accident. I think it was on the west coast...
